What is M-Fuge?

M-Fuge is for your students who want to participate in Bible study and missions with students from other churches, led by Fuge camp staff.

REGISTRATION POLICY AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE

Registration Policy for All LifeWay Camps

Before February 1: You may reserve your spot at camp anytime before February 1, 2010 with no deposit.

February 1: A \$50 per person deposit is required for each reservation to be paid on or before February 1. If you have already registered, you are required to pay \$50 deposit per person to hold your reservation. Any new or additional reservation made after February 1 will require an immediate \$50 deposit per person. **ALL deposits are non-refundable and cannot be applied toward balance due.**

May 1 Cancellation Deadline: All cancellations made after May 1 will incur an additional \$50 fee for each person dropped. **When cancellations occur, deposits cannot be applied toward balance due.**

14 Days Prior to Camp: Final balance must be received 14 days before your arrival at camp. If it is not, your group will be charged a one time \$75 fee*

***Auto Payment Option:** Authorized Group leaders may give permission to charge the remaining balance to a church LifeWay account by calling LifeWay Events Registration at 1-877-CAMP-123. this must be done by May 1, 2010. Any adjustments for drops or additions will be applied to the specified account after camp.

WHAT TO BRING

- Linens, towels, pillows, blankets
- Water bottle that you can refill and carry with you
- Closed toe, closed heel shoes and shirts with sleeves to wear on ministry site
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries such as toothbrush and shampoo
- Sun protection
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering (optional)
- Ministry supplies if your group is doing XFUGE on Mission
- DO NOT BRING alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon
- DO NOT BRING radios, iPods, CD players, play station portables or other gaming devices, roller blades, skateboards – if students do bring cell phones please help be sure it is not a distraction at camp

TRANSPORTATION POLICY FOR FUGE

Groups must provide adequate and appropriate transportation and drivers for students to get to ministry sites & off campus activities while attending FUGE.

The best way to ensure adequate transportation is for each group to provide enough seating, with seat belts, to cover the number of participants the group is bringing. The vehicles best suiting the needs for use at M-Fuge are mini-vans, personal vehicles, 12 passenger vans, and mini buses. If 15 passenger vans are brought for use by churches, according to LifeWay Christian Resources and many state laws, M-Fuge will not load more than 11 passengers (including driver) on them.

What about large / charter buses?

M-Fuge will make the best possible use of large buses. While we welcome you to bring whatever source of transportation to camp that best suits the needs of your church, we must recognize that the use of large buses poses some significant logistical difficulty. If you bring a large bus to camp, we are asking that you make it available for use each day of ministry projects. Please keep in mind that the driver is required to stay on ministry site and is not allowed to leave. You may also be asked to provide, rent if needed, additional transportation to stay on site in case of emergency. This additional transportation could include cars, mini-vans, or 12 passenger vans. Bringing a couple of additional personal vehicles to camp per large bus is suggested for churches utilizing large buses as their primary means of transportation.

Bottom line

We want to make this as easy as possible for you, but we need you to understand that some weeks may have scenarios which require the provision of additional transportation, whether through personal or rented vehicles.

Bus Drivers

If your group comes on a chartered bus to M-Fuge and you plan on using that charter bus as your transportation to ministry site, you will need to secure lodging for the bus driver. The bus driver is welcome to be considered as one of your adult chaperones, as long as they will participate in supervising your students and you trust them to do so. If this is the case, you can just register him/her as an adult sponsor in your group numbers. If you do not wish to have the bus driver serve as an adult chaperone, you will need to make arrangements for his/her meals and lodging off campus.

Life Questions: When was a time you tried to run from God and His direction for your life?
When have you responded to God out of love for Him?
When have you experienced the mercy and compassion of God?

Day 2

Teaching Aim: Character = Obedience
Students will discover faithfulness in everyday moments leads to a lifestyle of obedience that honors the Lord and has lasting impact.

Study Passage: Shadrach, Meshach and Agednego

Daniel 3:1, 4-18
Daniel 3:19-30

Life Questions: Why does obedience not come naturally?
When was a time you obeyed God even when it was not the popular thing to do?
How can your obedience or lack thereof affect those around you?

Day 3

Teaching Aim:

Character = Sacrifice

Students will realize living for God requires sacrifice and how our response to those moments shapes us and others.

Study Passage:

Life Questions:

How do you respond to sacrifice in your life?
Why does your affection for other things often outweigh your love for God?
What are you willing to give up in order to live the life God has for you?
How does sacrifice in your life influence or shape others' thinking and response?

1 Samuel 1:27-28

Day 4

Teaching Aim:

Character = Integrity

Students will understand the importance of staying true to our original purpose and passion in the midst of struggle or success.

Study Passage:

Nehemiah
Nehemiah 2:1-6, 17-18
Nehemiah 2:19-20, 5:14-16
Nehemiah 6:15-16

Life Questions:

When are we to be people of integrity?
When was a time you compromised your integrity and what was the result?
As believers, what message does not being of utmost integrity send to non-believers?
How does our integrity (or lack of) reflect upon the reputation of God?

Defining Moment:

Nehemiah 6:15-16

Day 5

Teaching Aim:

Character = Commitment

Students will find that follow through and dedication to fulfill our calling are essential to experiencing the full life God intends for us.

Study Passage:

Jeremiah
Jeremiah 1:4-10
Jeremiah 1:17-19
Jeremiah 29:11-14

Life Questions:

When did you want to give up and quit?
What might we miss if we do not remain true to something?
What does being committed to a cause or person require from you?

Defining Moment:

Jeremiah 1:9-10

Quiet Time Focus:

Silence and solitude

SPECIAL NEEDS REQUESTS

Fuge takes the special needs of students and adults seriously. Meeting your needs and setting up your group for a great week of camp is important to us. While we understand that the spiritual need for your students is great, we would like to specifically know about physical and emotional needs. These needs include but are not limited to wheel chair accessibility, hearing/sight impairment, food allergies, etc.

If one of your students has a special need that should be handled before camp starts, please call our camp toll-free line (1.877.CAMP.123) and share this with our events registration team so it can be handled properly. The special need can also be shared with us via email at fuge@lifeway.com.

If your student's need should be known by our camp staff at camp, you have the option of completing a "Special Attention Card" for your student so this need can be addressed by the Fuge staff. You can print and fill out this card before camp, or you can fill it out on registration day at camp. You can find a copy of this card in the Appendix of this document.

NIGHT LIFE

We don't want to ruin the surprise by telling you too much, but there are a couple of themed Night Lives. You will want your students to have the appropriate clothes to dress for these two theme driven nights.

Tuesday Night– Fuge County Fair; come dressed in overalls, boots and a straw hat or other attire you might see at a county fair.

Thursday Night – Variety Show; dress up as your favorite historical figure like George Washington, Neil Armstrong or John Wayne.

Friday Night - Mega Relay

DRESS CODE

Make sure your child does NOT pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations
- Has spaghetti straps, except for sleepwear
- Is excessively short or tight fitting.

While at camp, we ask that students:

- Wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or two-piece suits covered with a t-shirt
- Wear modest shorts, dresses, slacks, and jeans for worship. Long pants or knee length skirts are required for students or adults participating in worship on stage
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc)
- For ministry sites, please make sure that all students/adults have closed toe shoes and shirts with at least short sleeves.

We invite you to join us as leaders in monitoring your group to ensure they are dressing appropriately.

SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS

- In order to provide the best atmosphere and supervision, we ask that all groups bring 1 male sponsor for every 5 boys, and 1 female sponsor for every 5 girls.
- All sponsors must be at least 19 years old. Basically, someone who has been out of college for at least one year. We encourage each church to select these sponsors at their own discretion.
- Aid in monitoring the dress code of your students.
- Encourage participation and promptness by setting an example
- College students coming with your group who are under age 21 and not a sponsor do not have to be included in your student ratio. For example, if you bring 5 high school boys and 4 college-aged boys, you will only need 1 male sponsor since the 4 college-aged boys don't count in your sponsor-to-student ratio.

BRINGING CHILDREN TO CAMP

We want you to be able to spend more time with the ones you love during your busy summer. Children too young to participate in our camp programming (completed 5th grade or younger) can join you at camp with the following parameters:

- Meals/Bed = full price
- No meals/No Bed = no charge

We want your family to experience worship together, but not at the expense of everyone else. We ask that you please take your child out of the service if they are a distraction to others. Children must have adult supervision at all times. Please also consider the needs of your students and ensure enough adults accompany your group to build relationships and focus on their camp experience.

Please note that while we welcome your children to camp the camp program is not designed for their comfort. We cannot make arrangements for your child to have quiet hours for naps.

CHURCH GROUP AND PARENT DEVOTIONS

Church Group Devotion is a time for each church group to be together in the evenings to debrief the day. This time usually lasts one hour. The Group Leader needs to determine what should be discussed or taught. The Fuge office provides devotions for this time which can be found on the Fuge website after April 1. Print this and bring it to camp with you, if you choose to use it.

Parent Devotions are also available on the Fuge website after April 1. This resource is for you to give parents so that they can follow along and know what your students are learning in Bible study.

RELEASE FORM

Every person coming to camp (adult sponsors and students) needs to complete two Fuge Release Forms. Both copies need to be notarized. You can find the Fuge Release Form in the Appendix of this document. If for some reason, a student or adult in your group does not want to provide their social security number, please have them complete the “Refusal/Absence of Vital Information Form” that can also be found in the Appendix of this document.

You should not have to bring payment with you, unless you have changes at the last minute, as payments are due two weeks prior to arrival at camp.

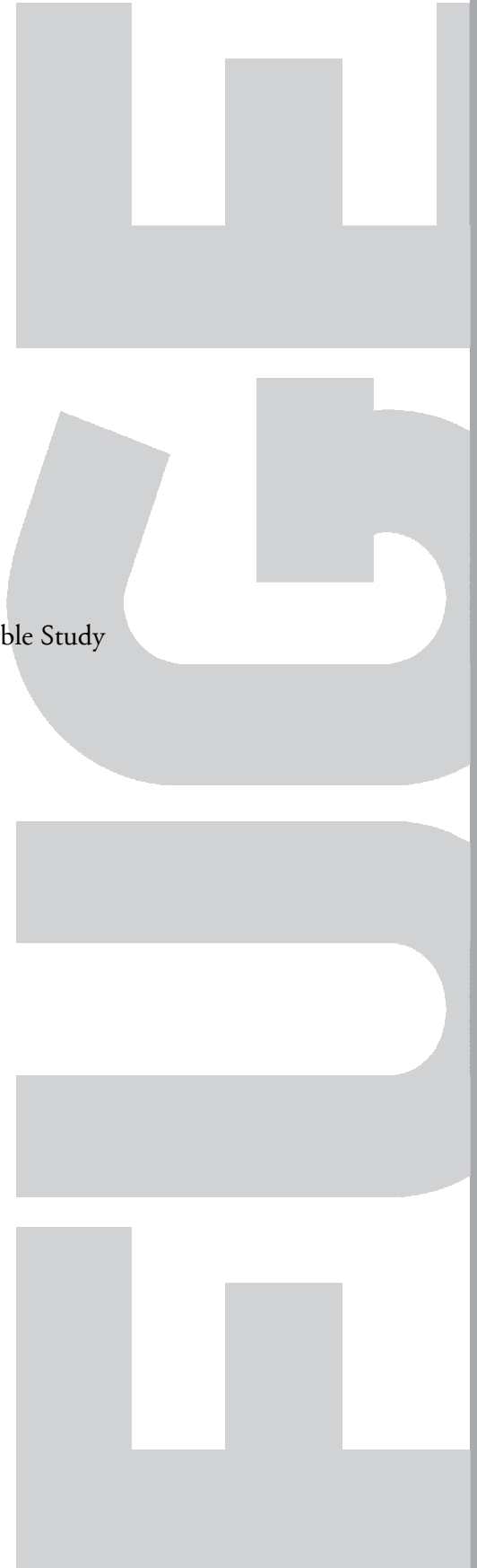

MFUGE MINISTRY TRACKS

Upon arrival at registration, your M-Fuge students will sign up for their ministry track for the week. They will participate in these ministries in the afternoon each day. Their options are:

Children's Ministry

This ministry track involves working with children in a variety of settings. These tracks could include Vacation Bible Schools, Backyard Bible Clubs, Day Camps, and other site-specific work with children. The purpose of this track is to minister to children, providing your students with the opportunity to teach and lead children in telling Bible stories, making crafts, and playing games.

Social Ministry

This ministry track involves a variety of ministry opportunities for meeting the physical, emotional, mental, and spiritual needs of people. This track ministers to the following populations and organizations: mentally/physically handicapped centers, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, food banks, clothing closets, furniture distribution centers, refugee ministries, centers for teaching adults and children English as a second language (ESL), prison ministries, Baptist Centers, Salvation Army Sites, and other community organizations with like purposes.

Painting, Construction, and Yardwork Ministry

Students in this track will spend their week building houses, roofing, repairing, cleaning, painting, and doing yardwork. These tracks work with various organizations such as Habitat for Humanity and the local housing authorities.

Creative Ministry

This ministry track uses the gifts and abilities of students to minister through drama, interpretive movement, puppets, clowning, singing, and other ministry performances. Students in this track will spend their week traveling to nursing homes, children's centers, residential homes, beaches, parks, and other places where they will be able to minister creatively.

Games and Recreation Ministry

This ministry track is designed to help students use their athletic ability and willing hearts to share the gospel through sportsmanship and Christ-like attitudes. These tracks are located in children's centers or homes, apartment complexes, and boys and girls clubs.

MISSIONS OFFERING

The summer of 2010, we will celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Fuge missions offering. Students have given more than 8 million dollars and last year alone students gave over \$611,000. This missions offering goes to support the work of both the International Mission Board (IMB) and the North American Mission Board (NAMB).

These agencies have allowed us to target specific ministries with which students can identify. Our offering going to the IMB will continue to support the work of missionaries working with the Romany people in Central and Eastern Europe. More than 350 students responded last summer by going with their youth groups to minister and multiply the hands and feet of the Roma missionaries.

Our offering going to NAMB will help to support their Current Canada summer missions program. Current Canada is a partnership project between the North American Mission Board and the Canadian National Baptist Convention. This program is open to students who have completed the 11th grade or higher. You can check out their website at www.currentcanada.com.

You have the opportunity to pray, give, and go to help these people groups learn about the gospel. A missions offering will be collected at camp this summer, we hope you will begin praying now about what your church group can give.

FREE TIME ACTIVITIES

Downtown

Also down that way is the Nashville Hard Rock Café. 2nd Avenue also has lots of Country Music stores on the strip.

Opry Mills Mall

This mall is located right beside the beautiful Opryland hotel. This mall is an outlet type indoor mall with lots of stores. They have an IMAX theater as well as a regular large theater and a store called “Dave and Busters” that has bowling and lots of arcade games that teens love as well as good food and big screen televisions showing sports games. There are other fun restaurants there like the Aquarium restaurant, Johnny Rockets, and Rainforest Café. The Mall at Green Hills

2126 Abbott Martin Road // Nashville. About 10 minutes from Belmont. Great shopping, trendy stores, and restaurants such as the Cheesecake Factory, California Pizza Kitchen, Ruby Tuesday’s and much more. There is also a movie theater at this mall.

Grand Old Golf and Go Karts

This putt putt locale is very near Opry Mills mall so you could bring your group here and then finish off at the mall or vice versa.
